

## The New York Society Library Announces the 2023-2024 New York City Book Awards

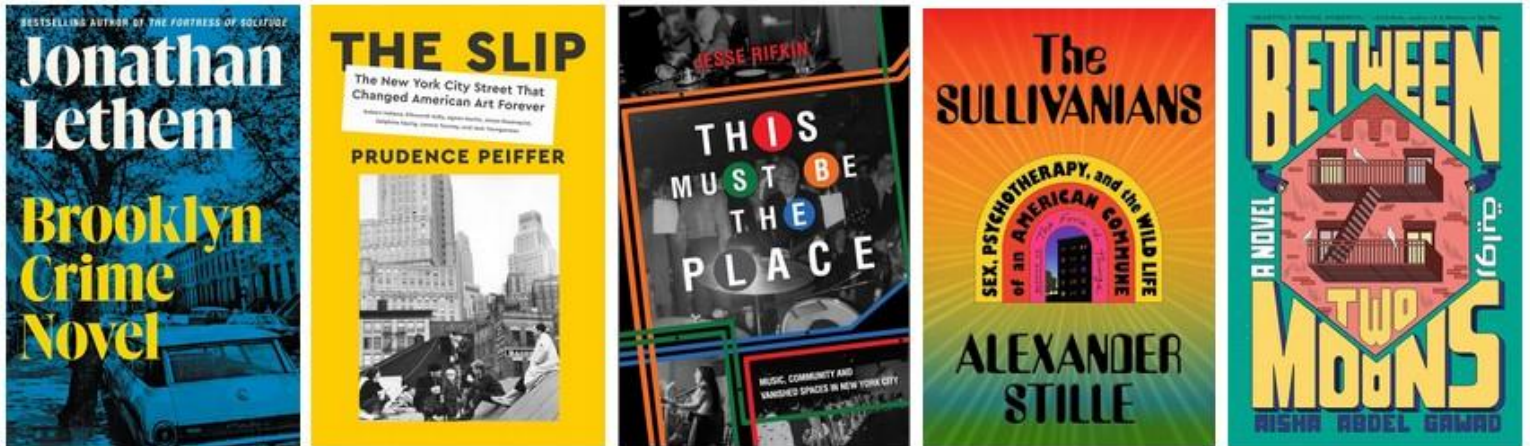

Members of the book awards selection committee read and reviewed approximately 150 books published in 2023 with New York City as their major topic or setting. The winners qualify as titles of literary quality or historical importance that evoke the spirit or enhance appreciation of New York City, shedding some new or unusual light on it. The Hornblower Award, established in 2011, is for excellent New York City-related books by first-time authors.

The selection committee was chaired by Nikhil Iyengar and included Debby Applegate, Kate Feiffer, Anita Kapadia, James Melo, and Tracy Quan.
